- **Detail:** This workshop will focus on the relationship of spirituality and psychology to sexuality and intimacy within a Christian perspective. It will draw extensively on the work of psychologist David Schnarch, *Constructing the Sexual Crucible*, the writing of Fr. Ron Rolheiser and other theologians, and research on the effect of the brain on sex, sexuality and intimacy. Attention also will be given to individual and Christian attitudes, values and beliefs and how these factors effect who we are as sexual and spiritual beings. There will be ample opportunity for group discussion.
- **Presenter:** Rev. Wilburn (Bill) Nelson, Ph.D. was Professor of Pastoral Theology at the Lutheran Theological Seminary, Saskatoon, for 25 years. Upon retiring from teaching, Bill opened a full-time practice in individual, marital and family therapy, and clinical supervision of therapists for 10 years. He is a Clinical Fellow with the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy, a Clinical Fellow with the Registry of Marriage and Family Therapists in Canada, and a Diplomate in the American Association of Pastoral Counselors. Bill is one of two Canadians on the International Advisory Committee of the Journal of Spirituality and Mental Health, and has led a number of Progoff Intensive Journal Workshops in Saskatchewan, Alberta and Manitoba.
