

# Faith Stages on the Spiritual Journey

**Detail:** What is adult faith? With reference to James Fowler's stages of faith development, in this session we will examine elements of the human faith journey outlined by St. Paul: "When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways" (1Cor. 13:11). Some elements to be considered will be the various levels of cognitive development, abilities in perspective-taking, sources of authority, bounds of social awareness, and forms of moral judgment. We will also examine differences in the male and female spiritual journeys.

**Presenter:** **Sister Teresita Kambeitz** teaches theology for teachers in the Master of Religious Education program. She also gives talks and conducts retreats throughout the diocese and beyond. Her vocation as teacher has been carried out in Swift Current, Holy Cross High School and St. Thomas More College in Saskatoon, Newman Theological College in Edmonton as well as overseas in summer courses for teachers in the Caribbean, Venezuela, Latvia and South Africa.
