## **Eco-Spirituality**

# INTEGRATING OUR FAITH IN THE 21ST CENTURY

With extreme weather patterns hitting headlines throughout 2023-24, human life on earth is becoming ever more vulnerable, requiring a new sense of spirituality so that we can engage more meaningfully with the ecological challenges of our time.

The ecological crisis is also a summons to profound interior conversion. Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not optional or a secondary aspect of our Christian experience. (Laudato Si #217)

We will explore these four topics in this series:

**WEEK 1**. How does Eco-Spirituality differ from traditional faith and spirituality?

**WEEK 2.** How does Eco-Spirituality help us to deal with the environmental traumas of our time?

**WEEK 3.** How do we integrate Eco-Spirituality with our Christian faith?

**WEEK 4.** How do we re-vision a spiritual practice for this new context?

May 7 - We will explore the meaning of Spirituality in our life today. Diarmuid O'Murchu will be quoting Laudato Si - a document written by Pope Francis which helps expand our understanding of eco spirituality, and thus expanding our faith in a new light.

May 14 - Diarmuid explains the creation paradox: spring time with new life and beauty of trees and autumn with dying and letting go. This paradox embraces creation/destruction, calvary/resurrection, but what has destroyed that cycle, and how do we cope with viruses, fires, flooding?

May 21 - How do we integrate Eco-Spiritualty with our Christian faith? We hear of Jesus not being kingly with 'power over,' but rather a relationship of empowering others, of mutuality, modeling how we are to be with each other and all creatures. It is a community of life, not dualistic thinking of sacred/secular. O'Murchu quotes several authors affirming this.

May 28 - How do we revision a spiritual practice for this new context? O'Murchu explores new way of seeing our God at work in the heart of creation while grieving the suffering and pain of creation. How can we revision the human, our rituals and sacraments, and key elements so that we are educated in Eco-Spirituality?
