Detail: This course is a study of the life and times of Jesus as described in the Gospel of Matthew. Participants will carefully read Matthew's Gospel and gain an appreciation for how the Gospel was crafted in light of its Jewish and Graeco-Roman context. You will also be asked to consider a number of the teachings of Jesus in light of contemporary culture, and learn new ways to incorporate the content of the Gospel into ministry and culture.

Presenter: **Adam Wright** began his theological studies at Acadia Divinity College where he was trained in Biblical Studies, the Dead Sea Scrolls, as well as a number of Biblical languages (Greek, Hebrew, and Aramaic). He completed a Ph.D. at McMaster Divinity College where he continued his work in comparative literature, especially Greek poetry and the New Testament. He now offers classes in language, Early Christian Scriptures, Hebrew Scriptures, and Theology, and currently teaches at the College of Emmanuel & St. Chad in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan.
