

Have you ever been curious as to how a Calligrapher got the letters to look like that? What goes into calligraphy? What makes calligraphy beautiful writing? And maybe the more pressing question, **can I do it?** This short introduction to Calligraphy is for those of you who have always wanted to try calligraphy, or are just curious about how it works. Maybe this is the year for you to begin. And, by the way, if you can hold a pen and make a mark on a paper, you can do it!

MAY I, HAVE THE COUPACE TODAY to live the life. \* that i would love, to postpone my dream no longer but to do at last what i came here for and waste my heart on fear no more. **Class Time:** We will go through the basics of what turns those marks on a page into calligraphy. We will spend time exploring what makes calligraphy beautiful. We will analyze examples, learn about the basic tools, inks, and papers. You will learn how to set up your workstation, rule paper, and use different Calligraphy tools. We will have fun with basic exercises using a Broad Edged Calligraphy Marker to get you ready for practicing letter forms.

Materials provided for this workshop include calligraphy marker and practice paper. Please bring a 12-inch ruler, two pencils and an eraser.
